



Newlands School ENROLMENT SCHEME

Newlands School has introduced an enrolment scheme and this is in operation from Saturday 20th April 2013.

The purpose of an enrolment scheme is to avoid overcrowding or the likelihood of overcrowding at the school and to ensure that the selection of applicants for enrolment at the school is carried out in a fair and transparent manner.

An enrolment scheme contains a home zone that has clearly defined geographic boundaries. Students who live in the home zone have an absolute right to enrol at the school.

- Out of Zone enrolments – information on the process for out of zone enrolments and the order of priority that out of zone applications are put in.

ENROLMENT SCHEME: Newlands School

HOME ZONE

All students who live within the home zone described below and shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

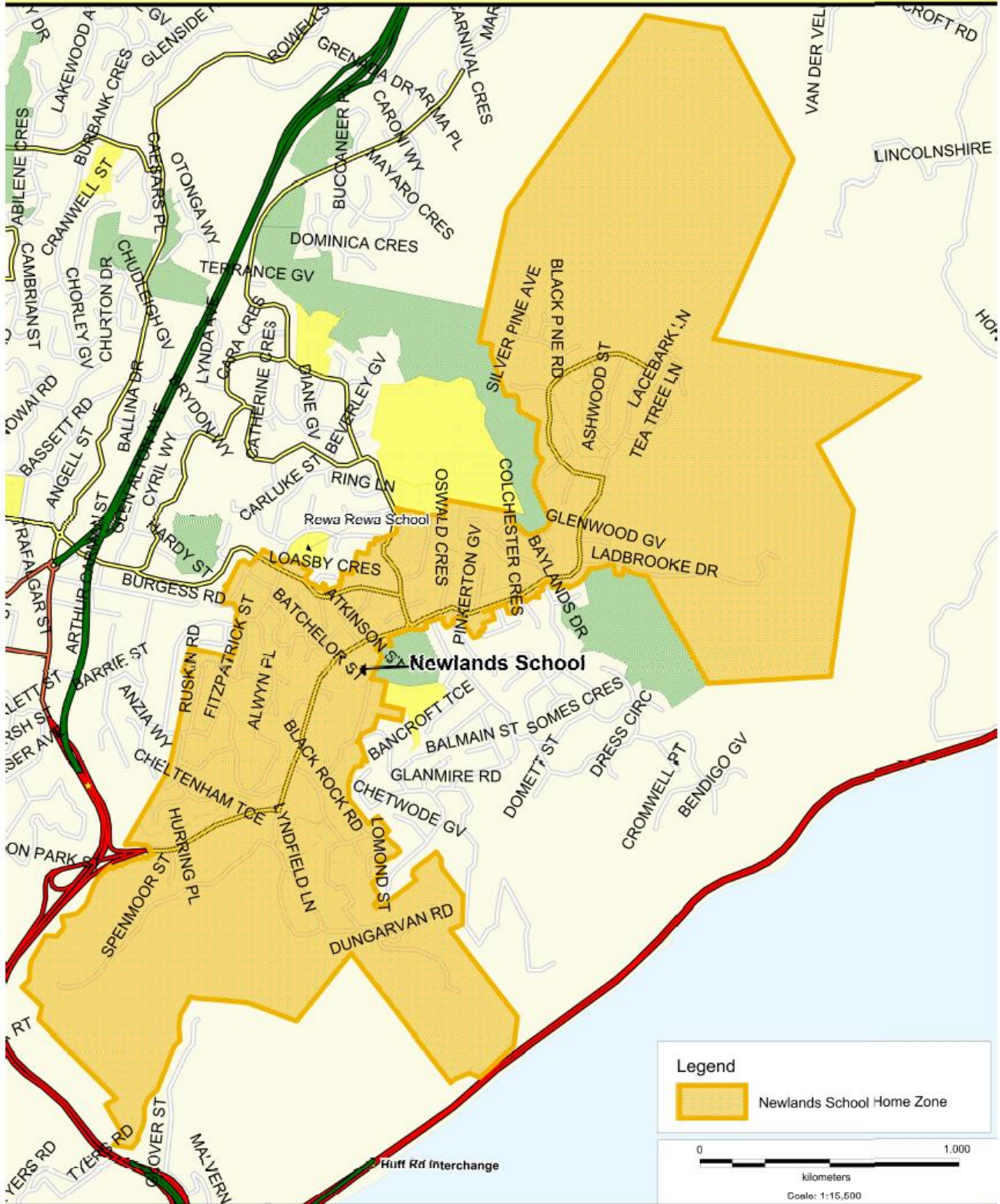
In a clockwise direction starting at the motorway (SH1) off ramp entry to Newlands;

- The boundary is a line so as to include in zone Evesham Terrace, Cheltenham Terrace and Cotswold Crescent addresses, through until the intersection of Chesterton Street and Salford Street. (All Salford Street addresses are in zone, Chesterton Street addresses are not in zone). The boundary line continues such that all Ruskin Road addresses are in zone.
- From the intersection of Ruskin Road and Fitzpatrick Street the boundary line continues such that all Fitzpatrick Street and Sloane Terrace addresses are in zone through to Stewart Drive.
- Stewart Drive addresses east of its intersection with Fitzpatrick Street are in zone. Loasby Crescent addresses are not in zone. Address numbers 1 to 49 inclusive (odd side) and 2 to 50 inclusive (even side) on Bracken Road are in zone. Padnell Crescent and Trebann Street addresses are not in zone.
- The boundary line continues, south of Newlands Intermediate but such that Oswald Crescent, Kingsbridge Place and Colchester Crescent addresses are all in zone. The north-west boundary is a line towards the intersection of Grenada Village and Mark Avenue and then continues round on the north-east side including all of the Woodridge development as in zone.
- Ladbrooke Drive and Horokiwi Road addresses are in zone. At the intersection of Newlands Road and Horokiwi Road the boundary then follows the east side of Newlands Park. Robert Street addresses and Glanmire Road addresses 1 to 31 inclusive (odd side) and 2 to 46 inclusive (even side) are in zone. Turville Crescent addresses are not in zone.
- Black Rock Road, Omega Street, Dunmail Way and Lomond Street addresses are in zone. Chetwode Grove and Edgecombe Street addresses are not in zone.
- The southern part of the boundary line is such that the home zone includes addresses in Dungarvan Road, Lyndfield Lane, Miles Crescent and Spenmoor Street, with a connection back to the motorway off ramp entry to Newlands (the starting point).

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students may be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the Board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

Each year the Board will determine the number of places, if any, which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. If there are places, the Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority	This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.
Second Priority	will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
Third Priority	will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
Fourth priority	will be given to applicants who are children of former students.
Fifth priority	will be given to applicants who are either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
Sixth priority	will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989.

Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
